When forests are cleared, the loss of trees disrupts these natural processes, leading to soil erosion,

reduced water quality, and changes in local and global climates. Deforestation is a major contributor to the increase in greenhouse gases, as trees that would otherwise absorb carbon dioxide are removed, leading to higher levels of carbon in the atmosphere.
